A message from our Chair - Rev'd Nick Gleich

I heard a story many years ago of a man who retired from working as a printer in a print works, printing the little cards that you could find in packets of loose tea. Let's call him Fred. He had enjoyed his work and the comradeship of his workmates. But he reached 65 and so, time to go. (It's a few years ago!!) Over the next few weeks, Fred started dropped into the factory from time to time and gradually started to do odd little jobs, including reorganising the cleaning supplies cupboard. Over time Fred build up the "little jobs" until he was in the factory five days a week and (almost) indispensable to the printers because his helpfulness. Eventually, higher management spotted what was going on and Fred was gradually and diplomatically eased back out of the door.

It's an interesting study in how the working environment operates. Did Fred spot that his former colleagues were lax in managing the cleaning supplies themselves? Did he take "work" from them? Was management asking the workers to do too much in addition to their routine work, so that management should have employed someone to do what Fred had picked up on?

During my working career I was twice in a position where I was partially or wholly responsible for working myself out of a job, rather than into one. The dynamic is curious because on the one hand you are trying to make sure the customers are kept happy and on the other hand, identifying to them that they will be looked after in a different way in the future.

Gloucester City Mission exists to reach out to those who are rough sleeping or vulnerable in terms of housing. When society has created an environment and services that make the charitable provision of such services redundant we will happily work ourselves out of our jobs at GCM. We can pray that that day comes, but until then, with your support, which is so grateful received, we will do what we can for those who need us.


