#### **Outreach Encounters**

Two of the clients who we have been working very closely with over this past year spent most of this past year or so living rough in Westgate Park, but a few months ago they were given a caravan to live in. This has enabled them to live the off the grid lifestyle that they choose to live but it gives them more shelter and greater security. Our staff teams regularly visit them and they frequently come into town to find our teams. On a recent visit to their caravan the staff were really pleased to see this fantastic cross that they had put on their door.

Recently I bumped into another of our long term clients. She has been using GCM for many years and was really excited to tell me that she had a job working as a cleaner in Southgate House on the next floor up to where we now have an office. She is currently furloughed but was proud to say that she will be starting back again very soon.



# **Homeless Situation**

The following article was written by Rick Henderson, CEO of Homeless Link and published in 'Inside Housing' on 25th February. For reference the official rough sleeper figure for Gloucester from the snapshot mentioned below is 11.

The government's annual rough sleeping snapshot is always met with keen interest and scrutiny, but the data for 2020, exceptional year that it was in many ways, will necessarily be a source of even more insight than usual. It is imperative at this point that government, the homelessness sector and health and other partners review the evidence, take stock of what we have achieved and acknowledge how much further we have to go. After a year of extraordinary action, we must make sure the next steps we take are the right ones if we are to fulfil the government's ambition to end rough sleeping by 2024.

According to the statistics, a total of 2,688 people were estimated to be sleeping rough in England on a 'single night' in autumn 2020, representing a 37% decrease from the 2019 figure of 4,266.

Homeless Link Thoughts About the Current As the organisation responsible for managing and verifying the data collection process, it has been useful to learn from different local authorities how they perceive the situation on the ground. However, we cannot call this a 'typical night' this year, and this is where things get interesting.


> While it is unfortunate that it took exceptional circumstances - a global pandemic - to prompt the focused action and investment required, it proves what can be accomplished with joint effort across government and between sectors. As we've long known, much of the expertise and will is there already, but the resources are often lacking.

> However, we cannot ignore the fact that thousands of people are still forced to sleep on our streets. This, and the fact that the number is 52% higher than it was a decade ago, remains unacceptable. It is also worth caveating here that the severe weather emergency protocol was actually in place in some local areas at the time of data collection, artificially lowering the numbers.
