This is the final Newsletter of 2020 and, as the year comes to an end, I just wanted to say **thank you** to everyone who has supported GCM this year. I joined the staff team here in mid 2018 and then took over as the Manager last December and am so grateful to the staff, volunteers and supporters for their efforts this year. It has been a tough year but we have had so many positives. One such positive can be found on the next page about Mike Curtis.

The move out of the George Whitefield Centre left us with no choice but to change the way we worked and we now focus more heavily on outreach work. These changes actually fitted in well with the enforced regulations around Covid.

I was recently at a meeting with the Local Authority and all of us we just so relieved that amongst all of the chaos this year there was not one single case of Covid amongst any of the clients whom we work with. Bearing in mind that way back in March when we had to close the Winter Shelter early there were major concerns about rough sleepers and the homeless community who were considered highly vulnerable because of their lifestyles.

Our move to focusing on outreach has been ever so successful. Between March and November we had more than 4600 direct interactions recorded with people in need. These interactions might be through giving food, drinks, clothes, toiletries, prayer or general support such as helping people to write CVs and apply for jobs.

We have lost nine regular clients this year to a variety of causes and they stay in our thoughts and prayers.



Revive...the first three months! The thoughts of Karen Williams, the Revive Supervisor

After several weeks of scrubbing and degreasing, and a training session on how to use the various machines, the Revive Coffee House opened on September 9th and of course we then had the second lockdown a month later!! We are the face of GCM on the high street and the first week was very busy with people eager to see what we are doing. Since then we have been building a regular clientele who really appreciate the peaceful, restful and safe environment that exists in the coffee shop.

We have a number of both men and women coming in on their own who really enjoy having a chat with us and we have also become a popular destination for people with additional needs and their support workers. I think the thing that has touched my heart the most was the two older ladies who set their elderly husbands up with a pot of tea and cake and who then left them whilst they went off and did a bit of shopping. It felt like a real privilege to be trusted enough to just keep an eye on their precious partners.

Louise's wonderful cakes are extremely popular and we always have a great selection. We always have a choice of vegan and gluten free cakes too. In terms of drinks we serve ethically sourced filter coffee, hot chocolate and teas. Jayne and Darren have the hot choc mountains well sorted with cream, marshmallows and a flake!

From a supervisor's perspective it has been so encouraging for me to watch my other team members develop their skills and knowledge and flourish in their roles. Both Jayne and Darren started off feeling very nervous and Jayne in particular was very anxious about chatting to customers. However to see and hear them now you wouldn't have a clue that was the case. They are both very confident using the machines and with the tasks that need to be done and they are amazing with the customers. They have a real sensitivity to people's situations and are able to chat with ease. The one thing that I have said applies to us all is we never need to feel bad if we are sat talking to customers. For some we could be the only people who chat to them in their week and the best gift we can give them is time and a listening ear.

It has been an honour to pray with folk visiting Revive and equally its been wonderful seeing groups praying in the coffee shop. God is working His purposes out in, and with, Revive. To Him be the glory for all He has done and is doing there.
