

Thank you to everyone who came and helped out, the clients really appreciated it.


We are aiming to run a Men's Day sometime in March.

This year's Survive the Night Event took place on World Homeless Day in October and we partnered with Gloucester Rugby to run 'Try Out the Night' in the Shed on the same night. A group of 50 of us spent the night in the rain and cold sleeping on the concrete steps of the Shed. The camaraderie was fantastic and we were able to talk with lots of people about our work and homelessness in general. We split the money raised, between us and the Gloucester Rugby Foundation, and raised over £13,000 from the event. Gloucester Rugby have already asked us to make this an annual event so please sign up for this year's event when we announce further details!!!

In addition we had companies and schools sleeping out for the night across the county and this also raised over £4000. We are so grateful to everyone who took part in both events.

During the day we ran a schools event at Kingsholm Stadium and a networking event for local charities and organisations working with the homeless and vulnerable to have a platform to show people what their work is about.

Winter Shelter

The winter provision has opened nightly from Sunday 1st December. In the first month we have had 61 referrals from P3, HHC, TTH, NHS, GCM and self-referrals, with 6 guests moving on to other accommodation.

Four full time members of staff have been employed to provide a safe, warm and loving environment. Local Churches are regularly providing a hot meal and we have a bank of volunteers to help with serving food, hot drinks, and giving out clean clothes.

Two of this year's volunteers were guests last year, the gentleman is now in full time employment, in recovery and in private accommodation, and the lady has moved into supported accommodation and has also volunteered in the pop up shop over Christmas.Christmas was a special time in the shelter, all guests received a gift bag on Christmas morning with new hoodies, joggers, toiletries, hats, gloves, socks, underwear and lots of chocolate. New year's eve guests were treated to pizza.


