The trustees and myself work tirelessly to ensure that we are good stewards of all of the financial gifts that we are given but at the end of the day the cost of living crisis has also seen an increase in the need for our services.

Those of you who know me or have heard me talk know that I am not someone who directly asks for money but on this occasion I am going to.

We would love it if you could bless our work with a one off gift or a regular gift. If you already give then thank you, thank you, thank you but if you have any capacity to increase your regular gift then we would really appreciate that.

The other ways in which you can help us out are by using our Revive Coffee House, I know that the coffee machine has been out of action for a couple of weeks but the reality is the milk pump broke on it and the cost to repair it was over £650, when the engineer did manage to come and fix it we found that it still wasn't working so we had to wait another week for him to come back out. It is fixed again now and we have been so pleased that there has been an increase in customers recently but if you are in town and fancy a drink, toasties, sandwiches, delicious cake or a gift from our Christian Gift Shop we would love to have you visit. We run it as a social enterprise so any profits come straight back into our work as well as being a way to employ an awesome staff.



Thank you also to the staff at Langley Wellington for their office collection and to everyone who responded to the appeal this month for clothes, items on our Amazon wish list and financial support.




